

Canada Summer Games

The Canada Games represent the highest level of national competition for up-and-coming athletes. The Games began in 1967 with the Canada Winter Games and have been hosted in every province at least once. They are held every 2 years alternating between winter and summer games. To be eligible, players must be 17 years of age and under.

Box lacrosse was first represented in the 1969 Canada Summer Games held in Nova Scotia and continued as part of the sport roster through to 1985. After that date lacrosse no longer met the Canada Games criteria as there were not enough provinces playing the game.

Men's and women's box lacrosse will be played in the 2022 Canada Summer Games to be held in the Niagara region.
